VIGEO: FIOODS OF FURY Cause-Effect Relationships Nonfiction Text Structure (single cause- multiple effects)



This is a list of some commonly used words authors use to signal Cause-Effect Nonfiction Text Structure. It is the structure that authors use when they want to describe what causes an event and what happens as an effect of that event.

The words in the left column signal a cause. The words in the right column signal an effect. When you begin looking for these words as you read, you will notice they signal relationships between key concepts or ideas that the author is writing about.

You may want to consider using these words in your own writing or speaking when you want to explain a cause-effect relationship.
