This is a list of some commonly used words authors use to signal Sequence Nonfiction Text Structure. It is the structure that authors use when they want to put events in order, such as describing a life cycle, telling about something in chronological order, or providing a set of steps or directions.

When you begin looking for these words as you read, you will notice they signal sequence, or order, of key concepts or ideas that the author is writing about.

You may want to consider using these words in your own writing or speaking when you want to put events in order.
