This is a list of some commonly used words authors use to signal Description Nonfiction Text Structure. It is the structure that authors use when they want to describe characteristics, features, attributes, or examples of a person, place, thing, or idea.

When you begin looking for these words as you read, you will notice they signal descriptions about key concepts or ideas that the author is writing about.

You may want to consider using these words in your own writing or speaking when you want to describe something, someone, or somewhere.
